Abstract: (few lines describing the staff week that SEA-EU partners can use for dissemination)	<p>The discourse on internationalisation is often dominated by a small group of stakeholders. In the case of universities, education leaders or governing boards usually carry out a general strategic agenda at an institutional level which, at times, does not adequately reflect the real needs or interests of particular schools, departments, or even students. These are voices that remain unheard and which prove fundamental in the implementation of internationalisation. This Staff Week will focus on how the Humanities could benefit from internationalisation in a way other than students and staff mobility. So, the participation of faculty and staff from diverse countries and origins will be a good starting point to reflect and share good practices on issues such as:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The internationalisation of the curriculum and the way it is implemented in our institutions through the teaching and learning processes. 2. Internationalisation at home and COIL experiences as a means towards connecting the global and the local. 3. Research as a tool for internationalisation. <p>The Staff Week will be organised in 3 sessions delivered by UCA staff and faculty and 6 seminars in which participants will showcase their own experiences in the internationalisation of the humanities from a teaching, research perspective or as staff working in schools of humanities.</p>
